

Kingfisher Class



This term in Kingfishers Class our children fully immersed themselves in the history topic Anglo-Saxons and thoroughly enjoyed stepping back into the past to learn all about life as an Anglo-Saxon. The children learnt about the Anglo-Saxon period in Britain and some of the major changes during this time including invading and settling. They found out about village life, the kind of clothes worn by an Anglo-Saxon, how Anglo-Saxon Britain was ruled and more. The linked text driver in English was the epic Anglo-Saxon legend Beowulf which inspired the children when writing their own myth.



As part of their learning experience the children had the opportunity to find out about the foods available in Anglo Saxon Britain at that time and they had the opportunity to make and taste Anglo-Saxon honey bread. Apparently, it was quite tasty!



The children learnt of the significant people during the Anglo-Saxon period in Britain. They used clay to create a statue of the Anglo-Saxon King Alfred the Great. Their design focus had to include one aspect of his legacy as a great king. Ask your child why King Alfred was known as 'The Great'.

This term in science the children learnt about States of Matter and have been finding out about the difference between solids, liquids and gases. As part of their investigation to find out about gases they carried out a variety of tasks. The children asked relevant questions and used different types of scientific enquiries to answer them.



Next term, our topic is Vikings and the text driver will be The Saga of Erik the Viking.
