What a busy week in Robin class!


Thank you so much for all your support with the Great British Birdwatch, the children absolutely loved it and it has been a really big spark of interest this week too. All the results of the watch last weekend are in and I have correlated all the data; next week we can have a look to see what birds we saw the most and least of. We will also discuss why this may be the case. The children already have a great understanding of how we can support birds over the winter. This week we have also learnt more about different feathers, nests and bird beaks thanks to a great book brought into school called 'Billy loves Birds'. In forest school following this interest the children made nests and clay birds exploring further the wildlife in our own Longparish area.

The children have really enjoyed learning the skill of bookmaking this week, stapling and writing their own stories, labels and captions. It is a great way to use their sounds and develop their fine motor writing skills for a purpose.


Heron Class were super lucky to have a visit from the Fire Service this week, sharing a little bit with us about the really important role they play in looking after our community, but also teaching us the importance of us knowing our own address and talking the children through what would happen if they ever needed to make a 999 call. Heron's had great fun listening for and responding to the attention command, and looking at the uniform fire fighters wear to keep them safe when responding to emergencies.

In maths, Year 1 have been learning how to use number lines to help us solve addition and subtraction problems and Year 2 have explored multiplying and dividing by 2 and ten. We have linked our History and English this week as we explore fact files about significant people, as we continue to learn more about why we remember Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole – the class did a great job remembering lots of the information we have researched about these important historical figures and creating their own 'Did you know...' fact statements. We will use what we have learned to help us write our own fact file about Mary Anning next week.

Heron's clay houses have now dried and the children were excited to see their finished sculptures. The children have been getting equally creative at home over the last week, creating their own pieces of artwork based on people who inspire them, as we prepare to finish our 'Inspire' topic by creating our own 'Hall of Fame'. It will be a lovely way to finish off the term by hearing the children giving their own examples of people they find inspirational.















In Kingfishers this week we have been learning to write using prepositions. The children have been learning to act the prepositions out of Tadeo Jones when he adventures through the tomb on his quest to find treasure.

In Topic the children made their own pyramids and learnt how and why pyramids were made. We wrote facts about these pyramids and were astounded to find out The Great Pyramid of Giza took 20 years to build!

In Maths we have been learning about remainders and solving problems which relate to this word. We have been using resources to support our learning of remainders.

ChaffinchClass

This week has seen Chaffinch reading another survivor story involving a submarine with Roger Chapman and Roger Mallison. We have compared this story to the volcano survivor story along with identifying technical vocabulary; noting what impact using them has on the reader. In Maths, Year 6 have been working hard to show their reasoning when answering a variety of revision questions, thinking about the most systematic ways of working. Year 5 have been persevering with multiplication and using the calculation policy as a good model of how to use a written method. It would be good for them to continue practising this at home using the policy to build up their fluency and confidence.

In Computing, they enjoyed planning their own parties this week using an excel spreadsheet. They were given a budget with a choice of items they would like. The children could identify errors in the formulae and correct these to mean the calculations were being made for them. As scientists, the class were able to explain extinction and prove using evidence that natural selection does occur. It was interesting to think about why it makes sense for humans to have two legs.

In Geography, we continue to identify volcanoes along with thinking about the benefits that volcanoes would have. It has been great to see some children making volcanoes at home already! We continue to learn about wisdom, debating where being wise means knowing a sum or if it means more along with linking wisdom to proverbs.

In Art, we are creating our own replicas of Theresa's Paden's work using oil pastels, another technique to build up the wonderful vibrant colours in her art work

On Monday we had a visit by the Fire Service who taught us how to be safe and what to do if we see a fire.


