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

Class Learning this week Robin Class

Wow what a super busy week in Robin Class!!

We started the week sharing our recycled models in Mr Roebuck's Earth Day assembly. We have explored different ways to join materials and reuse rubbish to make new things.

Our tadpoles are getting much larger now and have turned into froglets. They are ready for release into the wild on Monday! We made split pin frogs independently cutting and attaching the body parts.









The seedlings we planted before the holidays have grown well. This week we planted our herbs and sweet peas all ready to use in our mud kitchen! We also planted



our own sunflower seed to grow at home. We have entered a competition with Little School to see which children have grown the tallest sunflower!

Forest school was a fabulous adventure this week. Robin class and Little School shared a nature hunt spotting flowers and wildlife on our walk in the local area. We had a wonderful time out in nature and finding out local plant names.



In maths we have continued to develop our mental maths skills and have looked at making a repeating pattern. For PE we enjoyed a Joe Wicks warm up, a sensory circuit of activity stations and scarf dancing to cool down.

Class Learning this week Heron Class



Using our lovely English Learning journey story 'The Storm Whale' for inspiration, Herons have begun to explore features of letters. We looked at the difference between formal and informal letters and then used what we had learned to have a go writing a reply back to a character.

In Geography we have watched information videos about the different continents, making sure we found out an interesting fact to share and write about each. We loved seeing footage of how diverse the different places were in their environments and wildlife and listened carefully for important information about how many countries were in each continent and how many people lived there.

In maths this week we have continued our work on simple multiplication by making arrays and looking at how we can make equal groups, by grouping or sharing. We are getting very good at counting in 2's, 5's and 10's, we have some favourite songs that we sing together to help us learn this.

For computing this week we looked at how you can gather data about a particular question and used some of the skills we had learned last term to help us record this into a simple spreadsheet. As a class we explored the question 'what type of house do you live in?' We then used 2Count in Purple Mash to help us create a pictogram from the data we had collected. We enjoyed adding in our data and seeing the output that 2Count created, though we could see that there was only so much information we could take from this simple way of showing our data.

We were able to remember the moves to our first Country Dance routine 'Pat-a-cake Polka' in our PE session and learned some new moves as we danced our second dance together, the 'Galopede'. More fun and new routines to come next week Herons!













Class Learning this week Kingfisher Class

This week in Kingfishers the class have been reading nonfiction texts relating to our oceans. We learnt about the Great Garbage Patch in the Pacific ocean which is three times the size of France. We have been learning about how plastics and other waste damage the ocean habitats and how these marine animals consume plastics making them incredibly ill. We learnt that sea turtles have been found to eat 73% of garbage in their diets. We are beginning to explore how humans have impacted the Oceans and Seas of our planets and have begun to explore what is being done to protect our oceans.

In English we have begun to explore the features of nonfiction texts and what will be expected of the information page we will be writing about plastics in our oceans. Children begun to create their own poster from fact pages to study how non-fiction pages are created such as diagrams, captions, paragraphs, photographs and data. We have an amazing collection of non-fiction Ocean and Sea books in our classroom and will be using the internet to explore more about plastics in our oceans.








Class Learning this week Chaffinch Class

Chaffinch have enjoyed using our outside area whilst learning this week and we are hoping we can do this more!

In English, we have enjoyed reading more of our book, 'The Jamie Drake Equation' looking at how the authors use of language has created suspense along with writing predictions about what they think Jamie might do in the most recent dilemma, comparing this to what they would do themselves.



In Maths, Year 5 have been learning how to understand fractions as decimals by looking at different representations.

As Historians, we have delved into the ancient civilisation of Mayans. The children are very intrigued to find out about this time period, comparing life to other historic periods at that time and what Mayans have left us today. They have written some great adverts showing the features of Mayan calendars.
